

# Prepublication Open Review Information Volume 14 (2025)

NWR has implemented a continuous submission/publication model. Most articles published will be open for comments for four weeks in PREPUBLICATION OPEN REVIEW.

We invite comments and discussions on these articles. Our hope is to engage the community in a process of collaborative review, with the aim of enhancing the scholarly value of the contributions. All kinds of comments, from pointing out typos to more wide-ranging commentaries, are welcome as long as they are constructive and help the author improve the text. Extensive comments or discussions can, if relevant, be considered for publication in our Replies section.

After the four-week open review period, the author has the opportunity to revise the preprint version of the submission before publication of the final version.

## *How to participate in open review?*

You can comment on an article by sending a mail to [OpenReview@nordicwittgensteinreview.com](mailto:OpenReview@nordicwittgensteinreview.com). Comments will be read by the editors and then forwarded to the author. Commentators are expected to appear as peers, i.e. by their real names. If you have reasons to want to retain anonymity in relation to the author, please contact the editor-in-chief.

## OPEN REVIEW GUIDELINES

1. In your comment, please refer by article name and page number, or by quoting the passage you comment.
2. We seek constructive commentary and criticism that may help the author improve the text.
3. Use the dedicated email address to send in your comments.
4. Please note that Prepublication versions of articles are works in progress. Remember that the final version will be published after the four-week Open Review period. If you nevertheless need to refer to an article currently in Open Review, use the following format:
